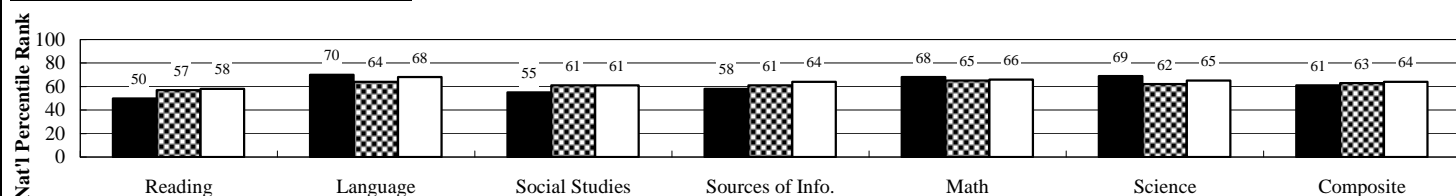

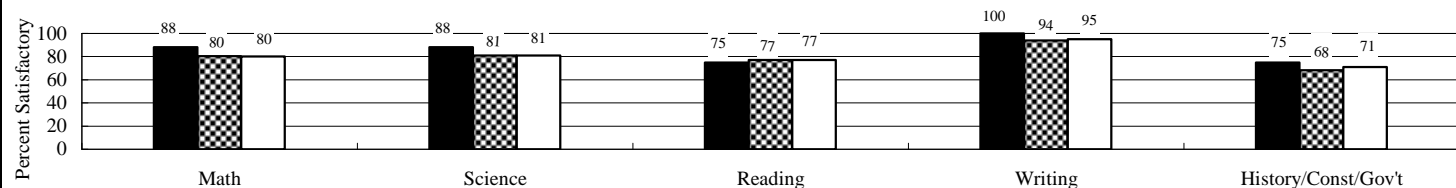
## 3rd Grade Iowa Test of Basic Skills

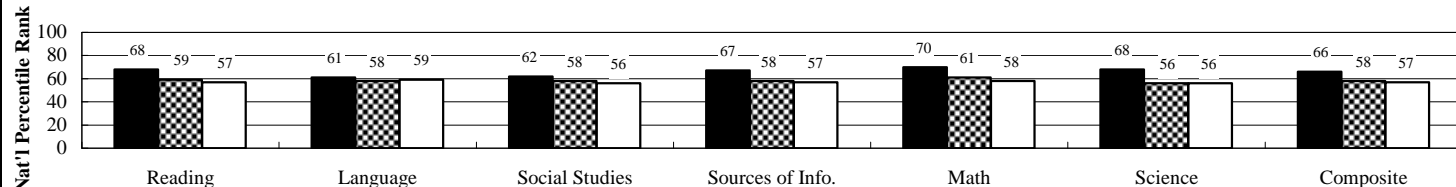
## 5th Grade Oklahoma Core Curriculum Test

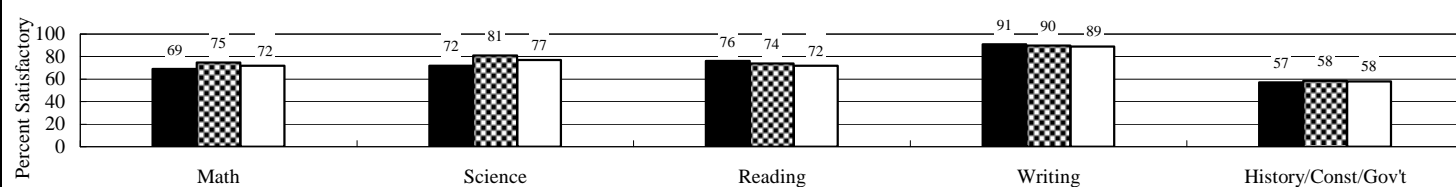

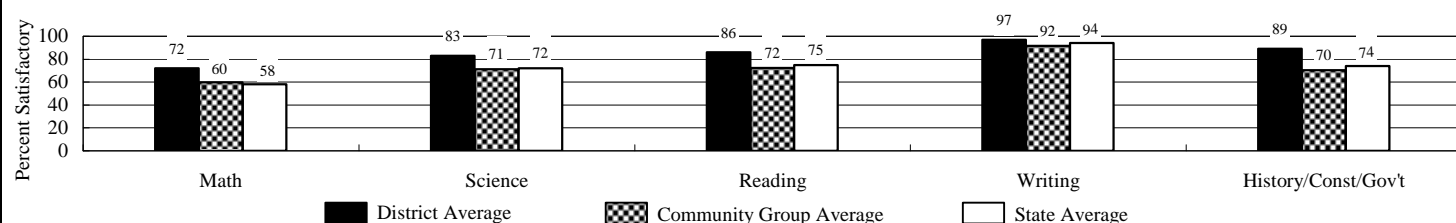
